## HANDS FREE DOOR ENTRY





## Apartment Station (APT1)

Some people with limited hand use, can find it difficult to use the telephone handset with a standard door entry telephone system. The problem may be overcome by using an apartment station system. With this system a telephone handset does not have to be lifted. Instead a wall mounted or table top speech unit or apartment station is used. On hearing the call tone the user presses the 'TALK' button to speak to the caller at the door and to listen they release the 'TALK' button. If the caller is welcome the user presses the 'LOCK' button to unlock the door which allows the caller to enter. The call tone can be muted if the caller does not want to be disturbed. Additional speech units can be fitted.

This system can be adapted for use by people with restricted mobility. It is possible to operate the system remotely by using a hand held radio transmitter. The speech volume is such that the user can operate the unit from across a normal sized room, hearing and being heard by the person at the door.

## Hands Free Speech (HDFE)

For people with very limited hand use this system will allow the user to retain control over who is allowed access into their property. Speech is controlled by the caller at the front door. To speak the caller presses the button on the door panel and to listen the button is released. If the caller is welcome the user activates the lock release to unlock the door and allow the caller to enter. The lock release is activated by using the a number of different types of switches. These can include the Locca Sure Touch or any other type of switch etc. Please note that with this system the caller can activate the speech channel at anytime. If nuisance callers are likely then a system with a call alert facility would be more appropriate.
