PLASTIC (PVCu) DOORS





Over recent years PVCu doors have become more and more popular due to low maintenance and improved insulation properties. These types of doors have multi locking points—at the top, middle and bottom of the door. Locking the door requires the handle to be lifted and the key to be fully turned.

This locking arrangement has meant that PVCu doors have not been suitable for using with door access control systems as electric lock releases could not be fitted to the door. Also, people with impaired hand use find locking and unlocking these doors difficult.

From the illustrations you can see that CDS Services has overcome this problem by fitting a white surface night latch lock to the door. This lock can be unlocked by key from outside. The brass electric lock release allows a door entry phone system to be fitted so the door can be unlocked remotely from anywhere in the house. Carers and friends can be let in without the need for them to have keys.

If the lock and release is combined with the LOCCA Sure Touch system the door can be unlocked remotely without having to use a key. Pressing the Locca keyfob automatically unlocks the door allowing the user to open the door—its as simple as that. A perfect solution for people with impaired hand use.





The existing multi locking point is left in place and is not affected in anyway. The new lock can be unlocked by key so that relatives and friends can have a key for every day use or in case of emergencies.
